Degree Objective/Requirements: Prepares graduates for transfer to bachelor degree programs of study by introducing a broad base of concepts in the humanities, social/behavioral sciences, mathematics, and natural and physical sciences. Graduates receiving the associate of arts degree will be prepared for further study at the university level in the social/behavioral sciences and related fields. The degree plan comprises 66 semester credit hours of which 56 are in general education courses and 10 are social/behavioral sciences. This degree is appropriate for transfer to a bachelor's degree related program.
