Texas Residency Verification Requirements

Residency for tuition purposes is determined by state law and decided by individual case. The following are general guidelines:

Individuals 18 years or older who move into the state and who are employed for a period of 12 months prior to enrolling are entitled to classification as residents. Students who enroll before living in Texas for 12 months will be classified as nonresidents until they have remained out of school for 12 consecutive months. Persons classified as nonresidents upon first enrollment will remain nonresidents for the period during which they continue as students.

Active duty military personnel stationed in Texas and their family members are eligible to pay in-state tuition by submitting at the time of each enrollment a statement by their commanding officer or personnel officer certifying they are assigned to duty in Texas. Forms are available at the Fort Hood Education Centers and all Central Texas College Offices. If military personnel and their family members wish to be classified as Texas residents, they must provide proof of residency. Acceptable documentation for Texas residency is proof that the sponsor entered the service in Texas and has maintained Texas as their legal residence; or an LES dated one year prior to registration which reflects Texas as the tax state, *one of the documents listed below is also required.

Individuals (and their dependents) who have separated or retired from the military during the past year must either prove their Texas residency during military service with an LES dated one year prior to registration which reflects Texas as the tax state and one of the *documents listed below: a DD 214 which shows original entry into military service in Texas and proof that they have not relinquished that residence, or have owned property in the state of Texas ** for one year prior to enrollment.

****Individuals who purchase property in Texas** one year prior to enrollment are eligible for Texas resident status. A copy of the property warranty deed is required. If the property is less than one year old but within the college district, a waiver may be given. Proof must be secured from the tax office. To qualify for waiver, property warranty deed and proof from tax office is required.

The Coordinating Board, Texas College and University System has established residency verification requirements which affect all new students and all returning students who have not attended continuously (including summer terms). It is required that all students claiming Texas residency (who are not connected with the military) submit to the Records Office one or more of the following documents, copies of which must remain on file in the student's record:

- ❖ Texas high school transcript from previous year;
- ❖ Texas college or university transcript from previous year;
- ❖ Employer's statement of date of employment;
- ❖ *Valid, Texas drivers license (at least one year old);
- ❖ *Texas voter registration (at least one year old);
- ❖ Lease agreement, which includes student's name and period leased (at least one year);
- ❖ Property warranty deed and tax statement from previous year;
- ❖ Canceled checks (at least one year old) from Texas bank;
- ❖ Utility bills (at least one year old);
- ❖ *Other third party documentation (notarized)

Those unable to produce documentation will NOT be eligible for state tuition rates.

Early Admission For High School Students

Early admission offers the opportunity for high school students to earn college credits while concurrently enrolled in high school. Early admission is open to any high school student, subject to the following conditions:

- a) An Early Admission Form with signatures of high school principal or counselor, and parent or legal guardian, must be submitted.
- b) Student must provide an official high school transcript showing classification as a junior or senior, attendance, any testing requirements for regular admission to the College.

NOTE: Central Texas College assumes no responsibility for loss of Interscholastic League or NCAA eligibility of high school students enrolled under this program.

Texas Success Initiative/Assessment

Central Texas College shall assess the academic skills of each entering student. Students who do not meet Central Texas College's entrance requirements will be offered the opportunity to take an assessment test. The results of the assessment test will be used to enroll students into appropriate Central Texas College classes. Central Texas College reserves the right to use any assessment instrument approved by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board.
