Fort Riley Education Services invites the public to attend the 50th Post-Wide Graduation ceremony, to honor our Soldiers and Family Members who have

accomplished a personal standard of excellence, in completing an Associate, Bachelor or Master degree.

Graduates will receive their diplomas from our seven on post colleges: Central Michigan University, University of Mary, Upper Iowa University, Kansas State University, Southwestern College, Central Texas College, and Barton Community College, and

from various distance learning colleges.

The ceremony will be conducted at Riley's Conference Center, on May 22, 2012 at 1:00 p.m.

### **Do you anticipate completion of your degree requirements at your educational institution by May?**

You may be eligible to walk in the graduation ceremony. Please contact your college office for more information regarding participation in the ceremony. If you are attending a distance learning college out of the area, and would also like to participate in the ceremony, call or visit the Main Post Education Center and speak with the event POC.

**Q:** *How do I know if a school is accredited, and will my credits transfer from school to school?*

**A:** All of the schools listed in GoArmyEd are regionally or nationally accredited. You will need to check on the schools website to determine which accreditation they have. The regional schools are normally your traditional colleges and universities and the national schools accredit various kinds of specialized institutions. It is up to the individual institution to determine whether they will accept transfer credits. Sometimes, nationally accredited school work is not transferred to a regionally accredited school, because of the specialization. However, if you transfer to another nationally accredited school, they may be able to accept the credits. The same thing applies if you start with one regional school and transfer to another regional school.
