ANTH 2301 General Anthropology
Principles of physical anthropology, human evolution, race, heredity, the organic basis of culture, and cultural history through the Paleolithic stage

ENGL 1302 Composition II
A continuation of ENGL 1301, emphasizing in more depth the principles and techniques of written compositions. Focus of the compositions is on the development of critical thinking as it relates to the textual analysis literary genres; the short story, poetry, drama, and the novel. Formal research paper is required. Prerequisite: Completion of ENGL 1301.

PSYC 2301 General Psychology
Basic principles of human experience and behavior involving biological, environmental and sociocultural studies. An overview course including an introduction to the major studies of psychology.

CJSA 1327 Fundamentals of Criminal Law
A study of the nature of criminal law; philosophical and historical development; major definitions and concepts; classification of crime; elements of crimes and penalties using Texas statutes as illustration; criminal responsibility.

CJSA 1312 Crime in America
The study of American crime problems in historical perspective, social and public policy factors affecting crime, impact and crime trends, social characteristics of specific crimes, and crime prevention.

BUSG 1372 Personal Finance
Personal and family accounts, budgets, and budgetary controls, bank accounts, charge accounts, borrowing, investing, insurance, standards of living, renting, home ownership, wills, and trust plans.

CRIJ 1301 Introduction to Criminal Justice
History, philosophy, and ethical considerations of criminal justice: the nature and impact of crime: and an overview of the criminal justice, including law enforcement and court procedures.
