<p><b>ACCT 2301 PRINCIPLES OF FINANCIAL ACCOUNTING</b> Introduction to accounting concepts and their application in transaction analysis and financial statement preparation; analysis of financial statements; and asset, liability, and equity accounting in proprietorships, partnerships, and corporations.</p>	<p><b>HIST 1302 U.S. HISTORY II</b> New social and industrial problems, rise of the progressive movement, United States' emergence as a world power, WWI &amp; WWII, the New Deal, and contemporary America.</p>
<p><b>BUSG 1372 PERSONAL FINANCE</b> Personal and family accounts, budgets, and budgetary controls, bank accounts, charge accounts, borrowing, investing, insurance, standards of living, renting, home ownership, wills, and trust plans</p>	<p><b>HRPO 2301 HUMAN RESOURCES MANAGEMENT</b> Behavioral and legal approaches to the management of human resources in organizations.</p>
<p><b>COSC 1300 INTRODUCTION TO COMPUTING</b> Effect of computers on society, the history and use of computers, computer applications in various segments of society, programming concepts, and hardware and software terminology.</p>	<p><b>MATH 1414 COLLEGE ALGEBRA</b> This course is recommended for students planning to transfer to bachelor's degree programs. Placement Test required or a grade of a "C" or higher in DSMA 0304</p>
<p><b>DRAMA 2366 MOTION PICTURE ART</b> This course provides an in-depth look at specific aspect of motion picture art. Subjects include docudrama, historical and biographical film, etc.</p>	<p><b>PHIL 1304 WORLD RELIGIONS</b> A survey course dealing with the origins, tenets, and development of the major world religions. Discussion of Hinduism, Buddhism, Confucianism, Taoism, Judaism, Christianity, and Islam.</p>
<p><b>GOVT 2301 AMERICAN GOVERNMENT I</b> An introductory, survey course on various United States, Texas, and local government topics. This course includes study of the U.S. and Texas constitutions, federalism, local government, national elections (state and local), civil liberties, interest groups, and political parties.</p>	<p><b>PSYC 2315 Psychology of Personal Adjustment</b> Focuses on the development of personal, social, and work adjustment skills. Students will explore a variety of issues relevant to health social interactions.</p>
<p><b>GOVT 2302 AMERICAN GOVERNMENT II</b> This course includes studying institutions of national and Texas governments including the executive, legislative, and judicial branches; the bureaucracy and public policy including defense and foreign relations.</p>	<p><b>SOCI 1301 INTRO TO SOCIOLOGY</b> The study of human society, human behavior and personality as a product of group life, community organization, social change and current social problems.</p>
<p><b>HIST 1301 U.S. HISTORY I</b> English colonization, the Revolution, adoption of the Constitution, growth of nationalism, cotton and the slavery problem, civil war, and reconstruction.</p>	<p><b>SPCH 1315 PUBLIC SPEAKING</b> Course encompasses both theory and practice of communicating with others and includes research, composition, organization, and delivery of speeches for various purposes and occasions.</p>
