- Log-in: Your permanent **user ID** is the letter 'c' (lowercase) + your 7-digit CTC ID. EXAMPLE: c1234567. Password, initially is your date of birth in this format: mmddyyyy. Select Login. If you are unable to log in, please contact the system administrator at (254) 526-1580 or email ssuccess@ctcd.edu.
- You will be brought to a screen that will ask you to confirm your BIO. At this point, you will create or confirm your new password. Passwords must include lowercase letters and numbers and must be between 6-9 characters (no special characters allowed). EXAMPLE: abcd12
- After logging in, choose a tutor from the Subject Specialties list that corresponds to the topic you need assistance with.
- To schedule a tutoring appointment, click the **Search Availability** icon/button.
- Next, select Academic Studio from the drop-down menu and select the date range and days of the week you prefer. 6.
- Select/press the **Search** icon/button.
- Review/select the best date and time for you, and click on the tutor's name to schedule an appointment with them. 8.
- Type in the Subject and Reason for the appointment and press Save.

Canceled Classes: A listings of any canceled classes will be posted in the lobby of Bldg. 3200 as soon as the determination is made. If your class is canceled, please see Student Records to enroll in a different class or to request a refund.

Withdrawal & Drop/Add Policy: If you drop or withdraw from a class for any reason all Active Duty using Army Tuition Assistance must see an Education Services Counselor. All others must see a CTC Counselor <u>OR</u> use Eforms. The last day to withdraw is <u>June 21, 2019</u>. Failure to follow these procedures may cause you to receive an "F" for non-attendance and be obligated to repay any tuition assistance or financial aid received to pay for the course. Financial Aid and VA students must contact the CTC Financial Aid and/or Veterans Services Departments before registering, withdrawing, or making schedule changes to avoid possible changes in awards/benefits.

Refund Policy: Students who officially withdraw from the institution or who reduce their semester credit hour load will have their tuition and mandatory fees refunded according to the following schedule:

From	May 28 – June 14, 2019	5%
From	June 17, 2019 and later	0%

Web Registration: You may qualify to register via the web for Fort Hood classes. Check with CTC Fort Hood Registration at (254) 526-1906 to see if you qualify. Payment is due at the time of registration. Failure to drop courses is the financial responsibility of the student who will incur the cost if not done.

Texas Success Initiative (TSI): Students must take the official TSI Assessment before registering for college-level credit courses, unless they are Active Duty Military or TSI exempt. Contact a CTC Counselor for questions regarding these requirements. The TSI Assessment is offered for \$25.00 in the CTC Fort Hood Testing Center, Bldg. 3201, Rm. 115. Call (254) 290-0701 for info.

Bacterial Meningitis Requirement: Texas law requires proof of Bacterial Meningitis vaccination 10 days before the term starts for all entering students under age 22, or the student must submit an affidavit for exception. Students must submit documentation through Magnus Health Student Medical Record (SMR), a web/based system for tracking and storing the immunization and exception documents. ATTENTION VA STUDENTS: OBL is Online Blended Lecture – these are classes that are 50% on campus face to face and 50% online. They are identified as Distance Learning Classes (On-Line) for VA.

Online Blended Lecture (OBL) Courses: OBL courses combine face-to-face classwork/lecture with online technologies, enabling the benefits of class interaction and independent work on-line. Attendance is required for scheduled face-to-face lecture. Mandatory work online is required for non-class days.

Active Duty Military Verification: All active duty military not using Tuition Assistance and military dependents must submit a Military Verification Form to be eligible for in-state tuition rates.

College Reenlistment Incentive Program: Designed for Active Duty Soldiers to attend college courses each day and complete up to 16 semester hours of college credit in 16 weeks. See your education counselor for assistance.

Registration Process for Active Duty Military via GoArmyEd:

- 1. Attend a GoArmyEd briefing at the Education Services Division, SDC, and obtain your GoArmyEd login/password.
- 2. Meet with a CTC Counselor to discuss degree requirements.
- 3. Select CTC as your home school, complete the common application, and choose a degree plan in GoArmyEd.
- Request your official Joint Services Transcript (JST) and official transcripts from EACH college you attended. Have transcripts sent to: Central Texas College; Attn: Incoming Transcripts; P.O. Box 1800; Killeen, TX 76540.
- 5. Once admitted, enroll in a course listed on your degree plan.
- 6. Upon receipt of enrollment confirmation, purchase textbooks. Textbook information is available on the *Class Details* tab in GoArmyEd or on the CTC website..
