II. PROCEDURE

To delete temporary Internet files:

- A. Open Internet Explorer.
- B. Click on Tools.
- C. Click on Internet Options at the bottom of the drop-down menu.
- D. Under the heading Temporary Internet Files, Click “Delete Cookies.”
- E. Click “Ok” in the pop-up box.
- F. Next, click “Delete Files”.
- G. Check the “Delete all offline content” box.
- H. Click “Ok.”
- I. Click “Ok” in the “Internet Options” box.
- J. Close Internet Explorer.
