## CAMPUS POLICE RELOCATES TO NEW HEADQUARTERS

On Thursday, August 3, the CTC Police Department began their across-campus move to their new headquarters, Building 137.



The new location is behind the Student Services Building 119.

Building 137 was the old records storage and after a four month renovation, the building added approximately 400 additional square feet of much needed space.

The Campus Police building now houses the Student and Staff ID Card section. This provides the campus community a one stop shop to obtain both your required parking permits and ID cards.

## PARKING PERMITS AND ID CARDS WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

When obtaining your parking permit or ID card, there are a few things that you need to know. Parking permits for students do not need to be renewed. The new permits are good as long as you attend classes at CTC.

For Parking Permits, students and staff must present:

- A Valid Drivers License
- State vehicle registration
- Class schedule-Students
- CTC I.D. Card-Faculty and Staff

For a CTC ID Cards, students must bring their current class schedule or student data form and a picture ID.

CTC staff and faculty must know their Colleague employee ID number.

## **Lost something? It may be Found!**

The Central Texas College Police Department retrieves, stores and disposes of all lost and found property on campus. Items turned into lost and found daily can be claimed by going to the Campus Police department located in building 137 during normal business hours, however positive owner identification of the item is required prior to the item being released. Lost and found items not claimed within 30 days are disposed of in accordance with local and state laws.

### **CTC Police Supports Childsafe Program**

Although weapons of any kind are prohibited from being possessed on campus, the Central Texas College Police Department does support firearm safety. This August the CTC Police participated in a nation-wide firearm safety program funded by the Department of Justice formally known as "Project Childsafe." The goal of project Childsafe was to distribute over 12 million free gun lock safety kits to the public. On August 9, 10, and 11, the CTC Police distributed 300 gun lock safety kits to students, staff and faculty on campus for home use. Project Childsafe, the nations largest firearms safety program, has encouraged millions of gun owners to practice safe and responsible firearm ownership and storage since it began distributing gun lock safety kits. ### **CAMPUS POLICE BLOTTER JULY 2005**

**July 1**—Officers were called to building 150 in reference to a theft. A staff member reported that money belonging to a student club and money in the lost and found were missing. The investigation is ongoing.
