## Campus Police Float Wins 1<sup>st</sup>

During the week long celebration events for the CTCD 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration which began Monday, October 10<sup>th</sup>, the Campus Police entered a hand made float in the first ever CTC parade. The float, made primarily of duct tape and card board was a replica of the CTC Bell Tower which proudly stands in front of the college by the duck pond. The float was the genius idea of Campus Police Sergeant Joe Ribar, who also masterminds the CTC Haunted House. The float also had a replica Spanish tile roof made from 404 8 oz. styrofoam coffee cups, which from a distance actually looked like the roofs on many of the campus buildings. Four other campus organizations entered floats in the parade and at the conclusion of the parade, Dr. Anderson, Chancellor CTCD, awarded the Campus Police float with a 1<sup>st</sup> Place trophy. The week long celebration activities also included a “Join a Club” day on Tuesday; cake cutting and re-dedication on Wednesday; a Fine Arts Department sponsored performance by guest artist Rhett Butler Thursday evening; and on Friday a Staff/Faculty BBQ lunch, an evening street dance featuring the local band “One for the Road” and the finale Laser Light show at the Mayborn Planetarium.





## GET READY FOR THE HAUNTED HOUSE!

It's that time of year again! The CTC 7<sup>th</sup> Annual Haunted House and Autumn Carnival is just weeks away and we need your help!
