CAMPUS POLICE BLOTTER OCTOBER 2005

October 3—Officers were called to building 118 in reference to the burglary of a coin operated machine. A CTC staff member observed a student break into a candy machine, remove contents and leave the area. Further investigation by the CTC Police Department identified the suspect who was subsequently arrested on Burglary charges and transported to the Coryell County jail.

October 3—Officers were called to the CTC football field in reference to a student who was injured while playing intramural flag football. The student was transported to a local hospital for treatment.

October 16—Officers discovered a stolen vehicle on campus which was taken from a Fort Hood soldier without his permission. The vehicle was impounded for safe keeping and stored at a local storage facility pending further investigation by the Fort Hood Police.

October 18—Officers were called to the Nursing and Science building 150 in reference to a student who was having a seizure. The student was taken by Killeen EMS to a local hospital for treatment.

October 21—A student who was in the Campus Police building inquiring about a parking ticket became belligerent and used profanity to the occupants. The student was asked to leave the building several times and upon constant refusal, the student was arrested, transported and booked into the Coryell County jail on charges stemming from Disorderly Conduct to Resisting Arrest.

October 25—An officer was called to the area of US 190 at Clear Creek Drive in reference to a possible auto/pedestrian accident. Upon arrival the officer discovered a body in the median. The victim was awake, unharmed, and was unaware of how he got to that location. Killeen EMS was notified and after checking out the 14 year old victim, he was released to his parents.
