CTC Chief of Police Gives Campus Presentation for Women's History Month



As a member of Central Texas College's Multi-cultural Committee, Chief of Police Mary Wheeler gave a short speech with power point presentation to kick off the month long activities for March's Women's History and Irish Heritage Month. The presentation pointed out that women had been attempting to break out in Law Enforcement as early as the 1800's however it was not until the 1960's that women actually went "out on patrol" as uniformed police officers. Ground was broken by the LAPD, a department that sets the stage for innovative law enforcement. Wheeler, who has been a police officer since 1988 began her career with the Killeen Police Department as a graduate of the Central Texas Regional Police Academy here at CTC. Wheeler stated; "If you are a women seeking to make it into law enforcement, know what you are getting into first, it's a tough but rewarding career".

February 2—Officers were called to the Tarleton University-Central campus for an abandoned vehicle. The officers impounded the vehicle which did not have any license plates displayed.

February 14—A female student reported being harassed by a group of students while she was in building 118 then into the Student Center. Investigation continues.

February 17—A CTC staff member used profanity to another staff member over a personal matter. The incident was referred to the supervisor for action. No criminal charges filed.

February 23—A student reported his cell phone stolen while he was in a computer lab located in building 118. There are no suspects or witnesses at this time. Investigation continues.

March 2—An internal theft was reported in building 119. Investigation continues.

March 6—A CTC staff member reported damage done to a computer monitor located in building 150. The damage proved to be a flaw in design, no criminal offense occurred.

March 6—An officer was called to Married Student Housing in reference to a civil disturbance between neighbors over use of the laundry room. No criminal offense occurred, the incident was referred to the Housing Manager for action.

March 12—While securing building 118, officers discovered graffiti on the back of a street sign. There are no suspects or witnesses at this time.

March 13—CTC Investigations received a Child Protective Services report in reference to possible child abuse in Married Student Housing. A small child was burned by a cup of hot coffee. The incident proved to be accidental however the child's caretaker was placed on warning for failing to provide medical attention for child.

March 16—Officers were called to US HWY 190 & CTE to assist the highway patrol with a motor vehicle accident. Officers returned to campus when the scene was clear.

March 19—An officer was called by the mother of a dorm student who was concerned about the welfare of the student who she had not been able to get in touch with for two weeks. The incident occurred over spring break and the student was vacationing.

March 20—Officers were called to parking lot D by the Nursing building in reference to a Hit and Run vehicle accident. The suspect vehicle had left the scene without reporting the accident. No suspect know at this time.

March 22—Officers were called to Married Student Housing in reference to a resident complaining of stomach pains. EMS was contacted however the resident refused transport to the hospital by ambulance and opted to go by POV.

March 23—An officer received a report of sexual harassment between a male and female student in building 118. No criminal offense occurred and the incident was referred to the Director of Student Life Activities for possible disciplinary action.

March 29—A student reported that while he was at the gym he lost his wallet and no one turned it in.

March 29—A staff member in the Records Storage building reported a box of personal items was missing. It is not known if the box was stolen or accidentally turned in with recycling paperwork. Investigation continues.

March 30—A student reported her wallet stolen while taking a test in building 111. A possible suspect has been named. Investigation continues.
