CAMPUS POLICE BLOTTER APRIL 2006

- April 2—An officer was dispatched to US Hwy 190 at Bell Tower to assist the Coryell County Sheriff department with a motor vehicle accident.
- April 3—An officer was called to building 112 in reference to a staff member who was having trouble breathing. EMS was notified and the subject was transported to a local hospital for treatment.
- April 3—A 911 call about a suspicious person parked in parking lot F revealed a male non-student harassing and stalking his ex-wife. The subject was warned of criminal trespass in campus housing and directed to leave, which he did without further incident.
- April 6—A legally parked vehicle in parking lot J was struck by another vehicle which left the scene without reporting the accident. No suspects or witnesses at this time.
- April 9—Officers were dispatched to assist the Killeen Police department with a major accident at University Drive and Clear Creek road. The vehicle operator was intoxicated and drove through a brick wall then struck the building at Tarleton University-Central. The subject was arrested for Driving While Intoxicated and transported to the Killeen City jail.
- April 11—A student reported his vehicle burglarized while he was attending class. A possible suspect was identified.
- April 11—A legally parked vehicle in parking lot M was struck by another vehicle which left the scene without reporting the accident. No suspects or witnesses at this time.
- April 11—Officers entering the east city limits of Copperas Cove observed a vehicle strike a shopping cart containing a small child in the parking lot of a local retailer. The child was not injured and the accident was referred to the Copperas Cove police department.
- April 12—A student reported her vehicle burglarized while she was attending class. Several books were taken from the unsecured vehicle. A possible suspect was identified.
- April 14—A female student reported being harassed and stalked by a male subject who she knows. The incident was referred to the Killeen Police Department because the incident occurred in the city of Killeen.
- April 17—Officers were called to Tarleton University-Central in reference to a staff member who was having a heart attack. EMS was on scene when the officers arrived and the subject was transported to a local hospital for treatment.
- April 18—A student reported his vehicle burglarized while he attended class. Stereo equipment was taken in this theft. A possible suspect was identified and subsequently arrested on three charges of motor vehicle burglary occurring between April 11 and 18.
- April 18—Officers were called to the Technology building #152 in reference to a dispute between a student and an instructor. The incident was referred to the Director of Student Life for administrative disciplinary action.
- April 19—A staff member was assaulted in the bookstore by a student. The suspect was identified and criminal charges pending.
- April 19—A student in the Criminal Justice building #113 reported being assaulted by a fellow student. A suspect has been identified. Investigation continues.
- April 20—A student reported being assaulted by another student while in a classroom on campus. A suspect was identified and the investigation is on-going.
- April 20—A male subject who was stalking his ex-wife was harassing her at the gym while she attended class. The subject was located and received a criminal trespass warning for the entire campus.
- April 20—A student reported her cell phone was taken from the restroom she had left it in. There are no suspects.
- April 20—A student reported her watch stolen from a locker in the gym while she attended class. There are no suspects or witnesses.
- April 20—A staff member reported some food items stolen after normal business hours from the refrigerator in their office. A suspect has been identified.
- April 25—Officers responded to a 911 call from Married Housing resulting in a domestic disturbance. Officers determined the incident to be a loud argument between boyfriend and girlfriend. There was no signs of physical violence.
- April 26—Officers responded to the report of a suspicious person in the bookstore, however the subject was gone upon the officers arrival.
- April 27—Officers served an outstanding arrest warrant out of the Killeen Police Department on a staff member. The subject was arrested, transported and booked into Killeen City Jail without further incident.
- April 27—Officers responded to the Nursing and Science building #150 in reference to a subject who was complaining of chest pains. EMS was notified and the subject was transported to a local hospital for treatment.
- April 28—A student who lives in Morton Hall reported that unknown persons put sugar in the gas tank of his vehicle while it was parked in the dorm parking lot. There are no suspects or witnesses at this time.
- April 29—Officers were called to Metroplex Hospital to assist the Killeen Police Department with two unruly subjects who had previously been warned of criminal trespass. The subjects were arrested, transported and booked into Killeen City jail.
