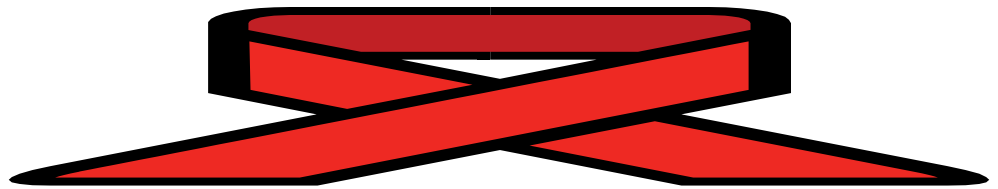

## **DRUG FREE—RED RIBBON WEEK**



Red Ribbon Week was established in memory of Enrique “Kiki” Camarena a undercover DEA agent who was killed in the line of duty in 1985 while investigating a major drug cartel believed to include officers in the Mexican army, police and government. Camarena was kidnapped, shoved in a car and later found in a shallow grave where he had been tortured to death. In honor of his memory in the battle against drugs, friends and family members of Camarena began to wear red badges of satin. Parents everywhere, sick of the destruction of alcohol and drugs organized coalitions who later adopted the symbol of Camarena’s memory, now the red ribbon. The Texas Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse began in 1997 committing resources to continue the Red Ribbon Campaign. Central Texas College Police Department promotes a drug free campus and its coordinated efforts along with the CTC Substance Abuse Resource Center brought you events during Red Ribbon Week, October 23-31. The week long event calendar included special guest speakers, demonstrations, and a host of valuable free information packets and film clips from local and state agencies. Students and staff members participated in a demonstration to feel the effects of different levels of “intoxication” while wearing drunk goggles and walking a straight line or riding an obstacle course on a tri-cycle. Each year schools around the globe participate in Red Ribbon Week and their goal is to promote an environment which is drug and alcohol free.





## CAMPUS POLICE BLOTTER SEPTEMBER 2006

- September 9—A student resident came to the Police Department to report a domestic assault that had occurred the prior evening between her and her spouse. The male subject was cited for simple assault.
- September 11—Officers were called to the Library in reference to a student who's music was too loud. The student complied with officers request to lower the volume of his music.
- September 14—Officers were called to the Student Center in reference to a theft. A female student left her purse on a table and when she returned the purse was gone. There are no suspects or witnesses to the theft.
- September 18—During a routine traffic stop the vehicle operator was found to have outstanding arrest warrants out of the City of Temple. The vehicle operator was arrested and transported to the Bell County jail.
- September 20—Officers were called to Married Housing in reference to a domestic disturbance between husband and wife. Upon officers arrival the male subject agreed to leave the residence for the night. There was no signs of assault.
- September 21—A student reported that after he left class he discovered that person(s) had entered his car while it was parked on campus and removed property without his permission. There are no suspects or witnesses at this time.
- September 21—A vehicle which was abandoned on campus by its operator was towed to a local storage facility.
- September 22—Officers were dispatched to assist the Killeen Police Department with a disturbance at Ellison High School where a KISD officer had been stabbed. The officer returned to campus when the scene was clear.
- September 22—An officer was called to Married Housing to assist CPS (Child Protective Services) in checking the welfare of a child resident who was recovering from a broken arm.
- September 26—Officers were called to Building 118 in reference to a student who refused to put her cell phone away during class. The student was identified and referred to the Office of Student Life Activities for disciplinary action.
- September 26—Officers were called to parking lot E, in front of the Student Center in reference to a hit and run traffic accident. One subject left the scene without reporting striking a parked car.
- September 28—A student reported damage to her vehicle however was unsure when and where the damage took place.
- September 28—A student observed a person remove an antennae from a parked car and leave campus with the item. The owner of the parked car could not be located.
- September 28—A student reported damage to her vehicle while she was in class. Unknown person(s) scratched the paint on her vehicle. There are no suspects or witnesses at this time.

## CAMPUS POLICE BLOTTER OCTOBER 2006

- October 2—Officers were called to the Student Center to stand by while a contract employee was terminated. After the termination, the employee was being escorted off campus when officers discovered he was in possession on a controlled substance. The subject was arrested, transported and booked into the Coryell County Jail.
- October 2—While the above subject was being booked into jail he was found to be a Fugitive from Justice with Felony warrants out of two agencies and another state.
- October 5—A student reported that while in the Library, person(s) unknown removed her unattended book from a table.
- October 5—A student reported that while in the Student Center her purse disappeared. There were no witnesses or suspects in this theft.
- October 12—A staff member reported that her car's license plate was missing but she didn't know when or where it came up missing from.
- October 13—Officers were called to building 119 in reference to a disturbance between a former student and CTC staff. The student was escorted off campus with no further incident.
- October 16—Officers were called to the Welding shop in reference to a student who became disruptive in class. The student was asked and did leave the class without further incident. The student was referred to the Office of Student Life Activities for disciplinary action.
- October 17—A student reported her car was damaged while it was parked by the Student Center. There are no witnesses or suspects.
- October 18—Officers were called to the Nursing parking lot G in reference to damage done to the ACT driving school truck.
- October 20—Officers were called to Married Housing in reference to an assault that took place on the school bus. The incident was referred to the KISD.
- October 20—Officers assisted the Killeen Police Department in recovering evidence disposed of in the CTC duck pond which was related to a murder in Killeen the previous weekend.
- October 24—Officers were called to parking lot I in reference to a hit and run accident. A parked vehicle was struck and the vehicle operator failed to report the accident.
- October 26—Officers were called to parking lot C in reference to a vehicle theft. There are no suspects or witnesses.
- October 27—Officers were called to Married Housing in reference to a 9 year old child being left home alone. The incident was referred to CPS for action.
- October 30—Officers were called to Morton Hall in reference to an air gun being found in one of the student residents room. The air-gun was confiscated and the student referred to the Office of Student Life Activities for administrative disciplinary action.
