**TIMELY WARNING NOTIFICATION BULLETIN #2011-002**  
**Possible Threat to the Campus Community**  
**"Your Right to Know"**  
**September 28, 2011**

In compliance with the "Timely Notice" provisions of the federal **Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act of 1998** the Central Texas College Police Department is giving notice of a disturbing act of potential violence reported to possibly occur at Central Texas College - central campus.

**REPORTED OFFENSE:** Terroristic Threat (Texas Penal Code) constituting a written or verbal threat to commit any offense involving violence to any person or property with intent to cause a reaction of any type to this threat by an official or volunteer agency organized to deal with emergencies; place any person in fear of imminent serious bodily injury; prevent or interrupt the occupation or use of a building; room; place of assembly; place to which the public has access; place of employment or occupation; aircraft, automobile or other form of conveyance; or other public place. This threat occurred against an employee in building 119.

**SUSPECT:** Co-worker currently not on campus.

It has been reported an employee made threatening remarks to another employee about wanting to do bodily harm to a co-worker. Administratively the suspect employee has been removed from campus pending review by the college administration and the police department.

**DETERMINATION:** Possibility of incident occurring is potential however not currently probable nor imminent since the employee has been removed from the work environment.

**INVESTIGATIVE AUTHORITY:** CTC Police Department, Risk Management and Human Resource Management.

**SERVICE:** Investigation pending.

It can be assumed conditions continue to exist that may pose a threat to members and guests of the campus community. It is the duty of the institution and the campus police to warn of possible "dangerous conditions" on or near its campus and at affiliate organizations off campus; an "affirmative duty" exists to warn persons associated with this college of possible peril at the hands of some third party or parties.
