## House of York 1461-1485)

Edward IV (r.1461-70; 71-83)

Edward V (r.-83) killed along with his brother Richard "Princes in the Tower"

**Richard III** (r.- 85) The last of the Plantagenets. Killed at Battle of Bosworth.

#### House of Tudor 1485-1603

**Henry VII** (r.-1509)

War of the Roses, Married Elizabeth of York (Daughter of Edward IV) 1486. Eldest son Arthur betrothed to Catherine of Aragon. Arthur died weeks after wedding.

Daughter Margaret married to James IV of Scotland

Henry VIII (r.-47) Third son of Henry VII.

#### Married

1509 - Catherine of Aragon (Arthur's widow) 6 children annulled 1533 only surviving child Mary.

1533 - Anne Boleyn 3 children beheaded 1536 only surviving child Elizabeth.

1536 - Jane Seymour 1 child died in childbirth 1536 son Edward.

1540 - Anne of Cleves no children annulled 1540.

1540 - Catherine Howard no children beheaded.

1543 - Catherine Parr no children, survived her husband.

Edward VI (r.-53) took throne at age 9. Died of TB and syphilis at age 15.

Jane (r.-53) "The Nine Day Queen" Lady Jane Grey

**Mary I** (r.-58) Bloody Mary - Only surviving child of Henry VIII and Catherine of Aragon

Married Philip II of Spain - No children

**Elizabeth I** (r.-1603) Only child of Henry VIII who did contract his syphilis.

Never Married -The Virgin Queen

## The Stuarts, 1603-1714

James I (r.-25) Also James VI of Scotland.

King James Bible (1611)

Gunpowder Plot (1605)

Charles I (r.-49) (son)

Parliament revolted - Oliver Cromwell and The New Model Army

Tried for Treason - Publicly beheaded in Whitehall on 30 January 1649

Charles II (r. 1660-85) (son) The Restoration

1665 Plague hits England

1666 Great Fire of London

James II (r.-88) (brother) Glorious Revolution

William III (r.- 89-1702) and Mary, daughter of James II (r. 89-94) also William IV of Scotland

Mary died of Smallpox, William dies from complications from a broken collarbone.

Anne (r.-1702-14) daughter of James II. Married George, son of king of Denmark - 19 children - 14 stillborn.

Overweight, died of stroke, buried in a coffin that was almost square. 1707 Act of Union formally unites Scotland and England.

# The Hanoverians, 1714-1910

**George I** (r. 1714-27)

1701 Act of Settlement made sure only Protestant could inherit throne.

Unable to speak English

Spent half his time in Hanover.
