CHILD DEVELOPMENT

Economic, social, and educational changes have made the child care profession a way of life for today's families. Because of these critical demands, many new opportunities are available in the child development field. CTC's Child Development program provides students with the needed skills and academic training to meet these demands. The child care profession is overgrowing as society recognizes the importance of the early childhood years in shaping the whole child's physical, intellectual, emotional, and social abilities.

People working with young children must have exceptional skills: knowledge of child development and developmentally appropriate practices; boundless patience; good judgment, the strength of character; and maturity to exercise the balance of control and latitude that young children require. An Associate of Applied Sciences degree in child development enables students to own, manage, or teach at a child care facility in most states. The AAS curriculum is the foundation for various bachelor's programs in Texas. It can also provide a unique set of skills for various professions outside of child development. Child Development courses require students to complete lab hours or field experience working directly with children in the community or a child care facility.
