These standards are effective for P1 22/23 cohort. The advisory moved to keep their additional requirement of "two live intubation attempts" during the 2021 meeting. -During the 2022 meeting the advisory moved to end the pilot and adopt the new recommended minimums as cited by CoAEMSP, with on exception. The advisory still endorsed keeping the "two live intubation attempts." - A written plan of action was endorsed by the committee if any student(s) should not meet the "live intubation attempt." "Any student that has successfully completed all clinical requirements without obtaining two live intubation attempts may be allowed to simulate the live attempts in order to satisfy the requirements of graduation. Outcomes] Annual Report data Thresholds/Outcome data results Graduate Survey results Employer Survey results Resources Assessment Matrix results Other | -Committee approved the findings in the 2020 Annual Report and 2021 Pass Rates. -2020: Pass Rate 79.4%, Job Placement 80.6%, Retention 62.1% -Discussion was had about the closures to the campus and clinical sites due to Covid, no further closures are expected. -Most clinical sites are requiring COVID vaccines or approved exemptions. -Several sites are not allowing for any exemptions from the COVID vaccine. This greatly increases the likelihood of students not meeting the minimum requirements because of the constraints to certain patient populations. -It was also noted that until the start of P1 22/23 all entrance exam requirements were lifted due to the limited availability of the testing center. The HESI requirements are once again in effect. -2021 Pass Rates: EMT, 78%, P1 80%, P2 88%, and P5 89%. The simple mean programmatically was 85% in 2021. -Pass rates for 2022 were presented, but not endorsed as the results are not yet finalized. PURPOSE OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Advisory Committee must be designated and charged with the responsibility of meeting at least annually to assist program and sponsor personnel in formulating and periodically revising appropriate goals and learning domains, monitoring needs and expectations, and ensuring program responsiveness to change, and to review and endorse the program required minimum numbers of patient contacts. [CAAHEP Standard II.B. Appropriate of Goals and Learning Domains]

Additionally, program-specific statements of goals and learning domains provide the basis for program planning, implementation, and evaluation. Such goals and learning domains must be compatible with the mission of the sponsoring institution(s), the expectations of the communities of interest, and nationally accepted standards of roles and functions. Goals and learning domains are based upon the substantiated needs of health care providers and employers, and the educational needs of the students served by the educational program. [CAAHEP Standard II.A.]

Responsibilities of the Advisory Committee

- Review and endorse the minimum program goal.
- Review and endorse the required minimum numbers of patient/skill contacts for each of the required patients and conditions.
- Verify that the Paramedic program is adhering to the National Emergency Medical Services Education Standards.
- Review Program performance based on outcomes thresholds and other metrics (at a minimum credentialing success, retention, and job placement).
- Provide feedback to the Program on the performance of graduates as competent entry level Paramedics (for employers).
- Provide feedback to the Program regarding clinical and field opportunities and feedback on students in those areas.
- Provide recommendations for curricula enhancements based on local needs and scope of practice.
- Assist with long range planning regarding workforce needs, scheduling options, cohort size, and other future needs.
- Complete an annual resource assessment of the program.
