Old Business:	After introductions were made by those in attendance, Ms. Lolita Gilmore called the meeting to order at 2:16 pm.

The CRC did not approve the proposed changes that were discussed in the last meeting due to the changes not allowing the certificate plans to "stack" into the degree plans.

Adjustments will be made and put before the board again in February. Once approved, the changes will take place in the FAL24 semester.

The Human Services program (HS) offers a level I certificate plan. The proposed level II certificate will incorporate the level I courses and offer 5 additional courses (additional training). Both Level I and Level II will stack into the proposed AAS degree. HS intends to partner with universities offering a bachelor's in public health. HS is seeking to have the proposed AAS stackable into a BAAS.

Michael Daley presented the idea to possibly partner with TAMUCT Dr. Amuna expressed her support as well.

Kristin Wrights, employee (former Human Services student to complete the CHW level I certificate) Jack Richards, voiced his excitement at the proposal as it has been his ultimate goal to further his education under Public Health.

Ms. Kondrak shared the memorandum that approved revising Fields of Study (FOS) in Social Work. The revisions aim to facilitate credit transfer for community college students. The Texas Transfer Advisory Committee and faculty from across the state contributed to this effort. The memo introduces "Texas Direct," a strategic initiative to enhance communication and advising for transfer pathways in the state. Texas Direct focuses on seamless degree pathways between two- and four-year institutions, with the Texas Core Curriculum and approved FOS leading to the Texas Direct Transfer Degree. The memo further outlined the Fields of Study included in Texas Direct. It emphasized the importance of applying eligible students' credits to their selected majors, posting information on university websites, and informing students about the streamlined degree paths. The message encourages collaboration and participation in ensuring a direct path to a degree and workforce readiness.

This memorandum aims to clarify the distinctions between the Human Service's CMSW 1167 practicum, requiring 120 hours of hands-on training, and the SOCW 2389 Academic Cooperative, which involves 80 hours of observation. While SOCW 2389 is an observational but transferable academic course, CMSW 1167's practicum, though offering hands-on training, may not always be transferable, as it involves practical experience rather than mere observation.

Within the Department of Health Sciences, there is a challenge in determining the most beneficial training for students and the program. To address this, feedback was sought from community advisors working in the field.

Concerns were raised about introducing an "extra body" into non-profit organizations, mainly if the individual is merely "observing."

	From an educational standpoint, not all experiences are considered equally valuable, and fitting hands-on experiences into the curriculum while meeting accreditation standards can be challenging. The structured environment and supervision provided during hands-on experiences were crucial components. It was noted that individuals may find it challenging to open up to a licensed professional, let alone a "stranger" observing them. The importance of integrating the observed population into the process was highlighted.	
	While practical observation has benefits, it was acknowledged that it may not encourage engagement in a people-focused environment and could lead to disengagement. The diverse needs of student and non-profit populations suggest the necessity of options and clear communication to determine the preferred approach.	
	The importance of setting clear expectations before the start of training was stressed. Additionally, hands-on experience was deemed crucial for specific sites, particularly service navigation, as it allows students to form a more informed opinion about their future career goals.
