| Key Discussion Points Old Business: | Discussion Discuss the status of face-to-face enrollment numbers for the summer. Face to Face numbers are down, but in doing research it seems to be that many Colleges and Work Places are having that issue Every Summer session until last year had made, but we had to cancel Summer classes last year and this year for Face to Face, Online classes seem to be okay for enrollment KISD enrollments helped to make the Fall and Spring face to face classes meet Grades are down The question was raised about connecting the ISD students with the Killeen Explorers Program, having someone come out and explain the program Discuss the use of AI by students and tools used to check for AI use. Mr. Lorenz wrote a paper on detecting AI, prompted by a meeting where Department Chairs were trying to figure out how to proceed on catching students using AI to complete assignments Mr. Lorenz tested multiple AI detectors, Language models, and how they work There have been issues with being able to site CHAT-GPT due to the fluid nature of the responses it gives, but APA has come up with a way to site it There are ways you can detect if AI is being used and it has to do with language models and the predictability of | |

There did not seem to be that many students at last year's open house o Mr. Lorenz sent an email to two contacts at Killeen High that teach Criminal Justice to help spread the word about the Open House and help attract new students What is the status of our building modifications? o We are currently at 75% of the Building Project completed - having the plans drawn up, funding, etc. o There were a few cuts made, such as number of lights o Current projection is the August/September timeframe to begin actual construction work The question was raised if there has been any concern about construction work or building new buildings if the enrollment numbers are down, with funding from the State possibly being affected New Business: Discuss McGraw Hill Connect Pilot Program Mr. Lorenz is currently working on a Pilot Program with McGraw Hill for three of the Criminal Justice classes - CRIJ 1301, 1307, and 1310 The program has the book built into the course (students can opt out of that feature if desired) and can provide assignments from the Connect features Discuss classroom modifications Currently the Police Academy Barn is being renovated - insulation is being added along with better heating and air conditioning, providing a more suitable location for the Police Academy Cadets to conduct drills, PT, and physical portions of the Academy such as ASP. Room 110 which was setup as a computer lab is being converted into a regular classroom which will be a dedicated Police Academy Classroom along with Room 116. Room 112 - we are still awaiting the process of the room division to begin Discuss Telecommunicators and Jailers Programs We are discussing building this into a larger program for academic credit in addition to the CE version of the class Discuss certificates in Micro-Credentialing and House Bill 8 Mr. Lorenz attended the TACTE Conference in April with several others from CTC in reference to House Bill 8 House Bill 8 changes the way funding is provided to the College - it will now be based on Completion of Programs by students We are going to working on integrating some smaller certificate programs into our degree programs to meet the needs of the local workforce
