

Clifton Osborne (Director), Sgt. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• FERPA<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ FERPA, the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act as amended, is a federal law that pertains to the release of and access to student educational records. In compliance with FERPA, Central Texas College does not disclose personally identifiable information contained in student education records, except as authorized by law. One of the primary exceptions is that an institution may release personally identifiable information (PII), without the student's consent, to school officials whom the institution has determined have a legitimate educational interest. FERPA rights apply to any student regardless of age.• Title IX<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Title IX is a part of the federal Education Amendments of 1972 law which prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex in educational institutions, programs and activities that receive federal financial assistance.• COVID Policy<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ All visitors/vendors must sign an affidavit when visiting campus.○ Keeps employees, students and visitors' safe• New Instructors<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Chief Joseph Barragan, CTCPD○ Jimmy Hammond, KISD• Marketing<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Information cards have been created and will be sent out to local agencies, such as Lampasas, Copperas Cove, Killeen, Georgetown, Belton, & Harker Heights

<p>New Business:</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Availability of Face to Face Classes/Schedules Post Pandemic <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ More Face to Face classes have been scheduled for the Spring 2022 semester ○ Covid cases are been handled individually instead of shutting down an entire class • Continued Expansion of the ECHS Courses in the Protective Services Department <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Courses will be a combination of ECHS and traditional students starting with the Spring 2022 semester ○ The ISDs handle grade draws at different times from when CTC hands in grades, sometimes resulting in temporary differences in reporting of the grades ○ ECHS students are free to choose from Criminal Justice classes for electives for their Interdisciplinary Degrees ○ There does appear to be an issue with certain universities accepting all the dual credit classes listed within the degrees. • Discuss the Proposed Modification to Room 112 to allow expansion of number of classrooms <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ With the availability of Covid money, Room 112 is scheduled to have a folding divider added to the room in order to make two smaller classrooms while maintaining the ability to use it as a large classroom when needed providing flexibility for campus events, public events, etc. • Discuss the Continued Use and Development of OERs for Criminal Justice <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Mr. Lorenz has developed OERs for Fundamentals of Criminal Law, Intro to Criminal Justice, and Ethics in Criminal Justice. ○ The availability of material to make OERs for other Criminal Justice classes is very limited due to the specialization of the topics. • Discuss the availability of improving the Technology of the classrooms <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Computers were purchased with Covid money, however there is a shortage in IT staff to install the new equipment. ○ Some new computers have been installed in the classrooms, but others are still on the list to be updated. ○ Is there availability of grants to use to purchase equipment and technology
