Old Business:	Nineteen cadets from BPOC Charlie 2023 graduated on Sept. 22, 2023. Seventeen passed the TCOLE exam on their first attempt. The remaining two passed the TCOLE exam on their second attempt.  Lt. Osborne had the class analysis which breaks it down by Units, which will be sent out by email to the Board Members
	<ul> <li>BPOC Alpha started with eight cadets. One was dismissed for possessing alcohol on campus.</li> </ul>
	BPOC Delta began with 24 cadets. One was dismissed for failing to meet academic standards.      The Academy has made a lot of changes to in the way the classes are delivered and it has been having a big impact, scores are going up
	<ul> <li>TCOLE announced they would require academies to teach an additional 16 hours for ALERRT training starting Jan 1, 2024. Central Texas College does not have a certified trainer for ALERRT. We are trying to locate a class to send instructors to but have not found one yet. TCOLE has not updated its website to reflect this. Lt. Osborne will try to obtain additional information when he attends the TCOLE conference next week.</li> <li>To accommodate the new hours, the Academy will be extended by one week</li> </ul>

- Additional classes can be adjusted to accommodate any extra hours where needed
- The breathalyzers, Glock 45, and red dot sights from the Perkins grant came in.
- Our current policy requires any cadet dismissed for academic reasons to wait one calendar year to reapply. I want to remove the waiting period and allow them to reapply at the next available academy.
  - o Lt. Osborne gave an example concerning a Cadet in the Day Academy that failed Unit 1 twice and decided to move to the Night Academy and is now one of the top academic Cadets in that class. Lt. Osborne feels the one year requirement is not necessary
  - Chief Wilson asked about the history of the one year waiting period, Lt. Osborne stated it was before his time
  - o The criteria for dismissal for academics was reviewed for the Board
  - o Mr. Miceli attended the Police Academy for Unit 1 with the Delta Class. He provided constructive feedback and recommendations for enhancing the learning experience of the class which seems to be making a big difference
  - o Lt. Osborne stated the biggest change is they are requiring the Cadets to take review test every unit and it is really bringing their scores up
  - Lt. Osborne brought up how certain situations, i.e. illness or death in the family can impact their grades and if they can come back, they have a better understanding of what is required of them
  - O Chief Wilson motioned to remove the one year waiting period to reapply after being dismissed for academic reasons. Mr. Donovan moved to remove the one year requirement. Ms. Groothoff seconded, the motion passed unanimously.
- We have renewed our contract with TCOLE, we received the paperwork yesterday. The new contract is good for another 5 years.
- Professor Lorenz has completed his first draft of the total training manual. We have made a digital copy available to BPOC Alpha and Delta.

Mr. Donovan seconded, motion passed.</li> <li>Current BPOC Class Status:         <ul> <li>BPOC Alpha 2024 began with 10 cadets. One of the cadets resigned before the class began. Another cadet was hired by KISD and placed in BPOC Bravo. Two cadets resigned from the academy for personal reasons. Six cadets remain in the class.</li> <li>BPOC Bravo began with 29 cadets. Two of the cadets withdrew for personal reasons. Two were dismissed for academic reasons. One of the two that was dismissed for academic reasons applied for and was accepted in BPOC Charlie and is meeting academic standards.</li> <li>BPOC Charlie began with 30 cadets. We have not lost any of the cadets for BPOC Charlie.</li> <li>We have 33 cadets for BPOC Delta which will begin in the last week of June. 	<ul> <li>Due to low enrollment, the Academy has decided to not offer a part time night class next year. We are currently down to six cadets in our night class. At the same time, we have to turn away applicants for our full time day classes. We will offer a 4th full time academy next year. We are proposing that Alpha and Bravo will begin on the same day in January, and Charlie and Delta will begin on the same day the last week of June.         <ul> <li>The question was asked if we had adequate staffing for moving to 4 day academies and the Academy staff will be able handle the new schedule.</li> <li>The question was raised concerning only having two start dates a year – it might be hard on Agencies only having 2. They might potentially lose cadets who don't want to wait that long to start, or find a better offer while waiting.</li> <li>It was decided that a new schedule with 3-4 start dates will be drawn up for consideration and</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>approval.</li> <li>On 4-23-2024 we had our bi annual TCOLE audit. We passed the audit with no deficiencies.</li> <li>The Academy is considering whether to discontinue instructing the ASP and OC class. We would like some input from the board about this. <ul> <li>The Board discussed that ASP and OC are a Force Option tool that the Cadets still need to learn. Agencies represented on the Board stated they still use these options.</li> <li>It was decided to keep teaching ASP and OC, with the option to revisit in a year if needed.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Officer Greenwood made a motion to dismiss the meeting, Mr. Miceli seconded.
